## **EDUCATION**

Host a Book Drive & Write Encouragement Notes to Young Readers: Metro
United Way's Little Libraries and Books & Barbershops initiatives help
provide more children with free and easy access to books which is a leading
indicator of a child's educational success. Volunteers can support both
programs by collecting books, writing messages to young readers on labels
inside the front covers and designing bookmarks.







#### KINDERGARTEN READINESS

The first five years of a child's life are a time of enormous social, emotional, physical and intellectual growth. For children to grow into successful adults, they need a supportive and healthy early foundation. We know that nearly 1/2 of the children in our community are not prepared to enter kindergarten ready to learn, and we know that children who start out behind, tend to stay behind. Together, we can change the odds for kids by ensuring they live in a community with rich learning opportunities that prepare them for kindergarten and set them on the path to lifelong success.

- Build Invitation to Play Kits: Promoting the love of learning and creativity in children helps them build lifelong critical thinking and problem solving skills. Early learning centers throughout our community—including Metro United Way's Excellence Academy centers—need Invitation to Play kits that allow young children to explore, investigate, question, examine and manipulate materials in ways that promote developmental progress and kindergarten readiness. The kits include items like tubes, ribbon rings, spoons, assorted stones, cups, etc.
- Make Welcome Baby Bundles: You can contribute to the health and safety of our community's newest neighbors by collecting and packaging essential infant-care items for expecting families. These boxes include thermometers, nasal aspirators, nail clippers and other essentials, as well as Metro United Way Ages & Stages Questionnaires (ASQ) registration forms. The ASQ program allows parents to monitor their children's early development, identify potential challenges and connect to support services if needed.
- Support Community Play & Learn Events: The earlier in a child's educational
  process parent involvement begins, the more powerful the effect. MUW
  engages families in quarterly Play & Learn events to help parents become
  their child's first teacher and best advocate. You can support these gatherings
  by preparing supplies for learning activities in advance, writing notes of
  encouragement to parents, and attending the event as greeters and servers.

#### HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION

High school graduation is a major indicator of a young person's success in life. In fact, high school dropouts are four times more likely to be unemployed as those who have completed four or more years of college. Since students only spend 20% of their lives in school, it's important that learning continue outside of the classroom. By establishing a system that helps steer local students toward high quality out-of-school time programs, MUW hopes to provide a stronger educational foundation to help decrease the high school drop-out rate and increase college degrees and career readiness, thus benefitting our entire community.

- Read, Tutor or Mentor: Research proves that caring volunteers working with students of all ages have the power to help kids boost academic achievement and bolster social and emotional development. MUW's Read, Tutor, Mentor program matches volunteers with opportunities to serve in those roles based on volunteer interest and availability. Visit metrounitedway.org/RTM to sign up.
- Become a Youth Program Quality Intervention (YPQI) External Assessor:
   Quality OST programs are universally recognized as an essential tool to help
   students increase their attendance, engagement in learning, test scores
   and grades. To help OST providers deliver quality programs to children
   in our community, MUW offers the Youth Program Quality Intervention
   (YPQI) system of evaluation and improvement. You can support not
   just one student but thousands by training to become a Volunteer YPQI
   External Assessor.
- **Assemble Healthy Snack Packs:** Help OST programs nourish student's bodies and minds by providing and packaging nutritional after-school snacks.







#### FAMILY STABILITY & BASIC NEEDS

The strongest communities ensure that all families have the resources needed to achieve financial independence with career opportunities that help them reach and maintain self-sufficiency. Children living in these communities have a better chance for a brighter future because healthy lives influence everything from how well a child learns in the classroom to how much an adult earns in the workplace.

- Make Budget Basics Bundles: MUW seeks to ensure individuals and families are equipped with the tools and knowledge they need to make smart financial decisions and manage their budgets effectively. You can directly support our family stability efforts by providing budgeting kits that include basic financial information, local resources, and essential budget development and tracking tools, such as calculators, calendars, registers, highlighters, and organizational materials.
- Help Community Members Receive Earned Income Tax Credits: With the help of our community, the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program has provided free tax preparation services to more than 97,000 individuals since 2001, resulting in \$142 million in refunds from available tax credits for earned income, children and education. You can help families achieve their financial goals by receiving training and serving as a tax preparer, site navigator, coordinator, reviewer, facilitator or greeter during tax season.
- Serve at a Mobile Pantry: MUW and Dare to Care Food Bank work in partnership on an expanded mobile pantry network that helps lessen food insecurity for low-income elderly, unemployed and in-need residents by bringing packaged meals to their neighborhoods. Mobile pantries rely on volunteers to unload and distribute food to attendees.

- Assemble Personal Care Packages: Personal care items not covered by assistance programs remain in high demand at basic needs programs throughout our community. Volunteers can provide and package soap, deodorant, mini shampoo, brushes/combs, tissue packs and other essentials to help all of our neighbors maintain health and dignity.
- Off-Site Volunteer Projects: If you would like to gather a group to volunteer
  at a Metro United Way partner agency, you can complete the Group Project
  Intake Form found at metrounitedway.org/volunteer. Possible projects
  include serving meals, painting, landscaping, cleaning and organizing.
